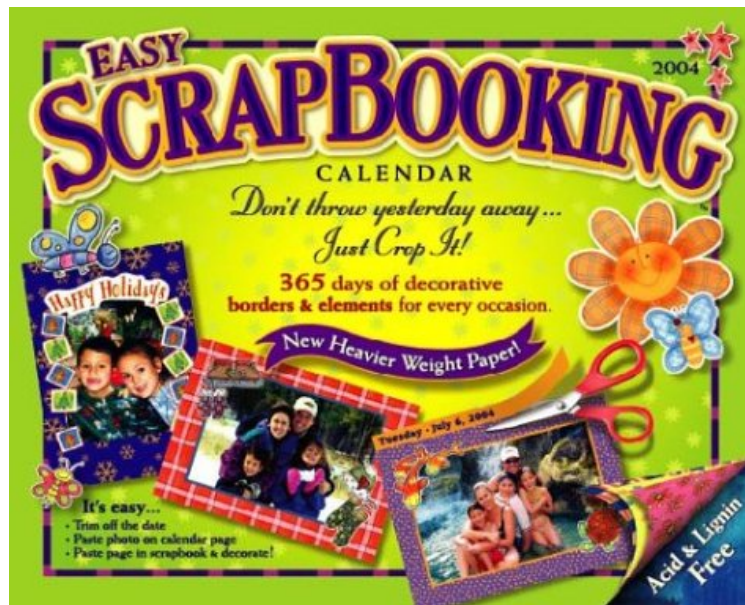

The packaging claims to have "new heavier weight paper," but it's not "card stock." I'm not a paper expert, but it feels like 24lb. paper was used--just a little bit thicker than regular office paper. This calendar a great gift for others, if not for yourself. The pages are kept in a magnetic flip box. Each day has a different design and usually there are 2 or 3 pages with similar themes to build a "coordinated" look. What I like best about each page is that almost everything that is cut out can be used one way or another for your scrapbook. The date is printed in a color bar at the top and has an uniform look. Most pages have borders that function as frames for 4x6 photos, and the paper you cut out from the center usually has matching graphics to supplement your layouts. Anyone who uses this calendar for scrapbooking will need to get a good exacto, or craft knife. Otherwise, you won't be able to neatly cut on the openings for the frames/borders. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Great for procrastinating scrapbookers! The one thing that I did not like about it was that some of the pages had borders and pictures within the border. It was hard to cut the pieces up without ruining either the border or the cutouts if you don't have fancy blade knives.
