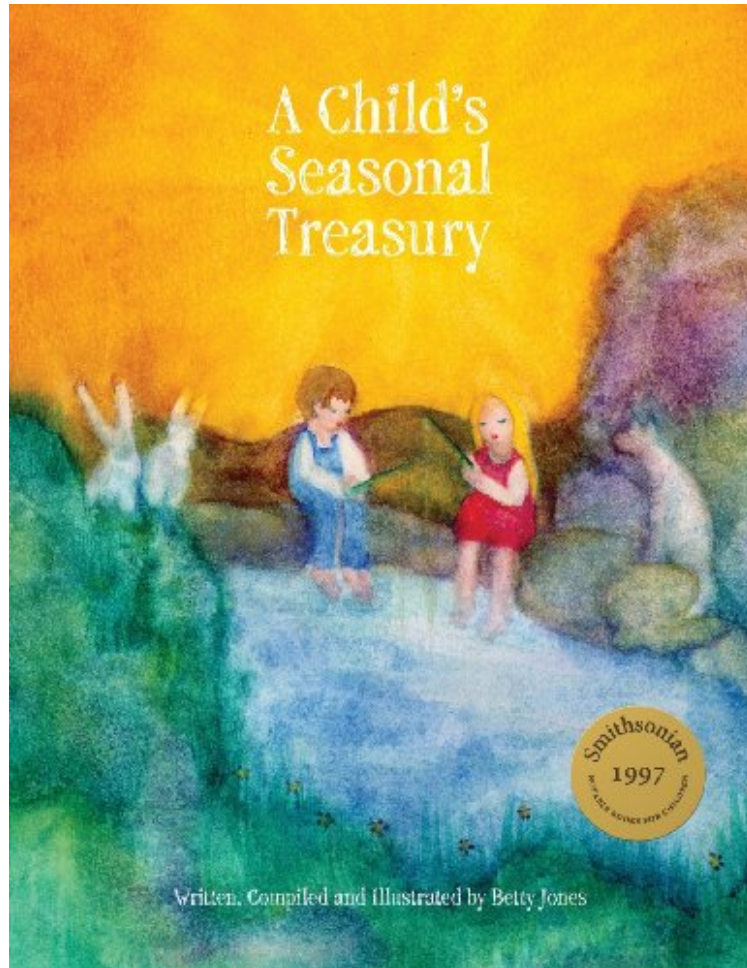

Rather than focusing on the Christian festivals as most books do, this book focuses on what is happening in nature throughout the year.
