I picked this book up (along with a few others) so that I'd have some nice reference material to learn from. This book is fantastic! I bought it for Kindle but I now wish I had the hard copy since the photos are so awesome. If I had bought the hard copy I'd easily award five stars. The Kindle version would benefit greatly from larger/higher resolution photographs so I award four stars instead of five. This is a useful book for teaching techniques but it's not a "follow along" project-type book; There are no step-by-step projects within. Rather, the author provides descriptions and photographs of some finished terrain models and then goes about explaining the tools, materials and techniques used to build them from scratch. The tone of the book is conversational. It reminds me of talking to a really nice hobby shop owner who is explaining to me how he built the models that I have been admiring in the store. If you are looking for a book to walk you step-by-step through recreating the author's exact projects, this is probably not that book. This

book WILL take you step-by-step through some higher-level techniques, along the lines of "here's how I made that mud puddle" or "here's what I did to get the look of real fallen leaves on the ground". You can take this knowledge and apply it to your own modeling projects. A fun, fascinating read.
