Loved this so much, I ordered the sequel.By CustomerI would have never bought this book through just seeing the cover but I saw it in a bookstore and loved it. I'm not currently able to spend a lot of hours knitting, because these little items are something you can finish in an hour, it was very appealing to me. I'll admit, at least half the items to be made from the book are not things I think I could imagine I would make but, there were many in there that I would like the tiny donut, and the tiny cupcake. You definitely need to be able to know how to knit with US size 1 double pointed needles with fingering weight yarn to make these projects. If you haven't tried using dpn's before and really want to learn, I recommend practicing first on something with a larger number of cast on stitches than 4-6 (try something with at least 15 stitches on each needle). Some supplies you might find helpful are Sox Stix by Lantern Moon (5" long dpn's), and some "sampler" (20 yards) yarns by MadelineTosh at Jimmy Beans Wool (only \$1.75 each) which is the same weight as the fingering weight/sock yarn recommended in the book so you don't have to spend money on a full skein of sock yarn (if you don't have leftovers laying around your

I love her tiny knitting books and have made nearly every pattern in her first tiny mochimochi book, Teeny Tiny Mochimochi. I read through the entire thing and there are three stories in the book with different patterns as the characters. The only thing is, there are a very small number of creatures pictured that are not written as patterns. For instance, in the ocean story, the little seashells are not featured as a pattern, nor are the little clowns in the circus scene. (The clowns are available for a price on her website, but I guess they are not mentioned in the book for some reason.) Nevertheless, this book is not to be passed over. It is not full of repeats or anything, like many books are, but rather is different collection of tiny items and slightly larger scenery for three mochimochi land stories.I recommend this book to anyone who, like me, loved her first book and wants more of Anna's tiny knitting. :)

What do a talking doughnut, a crabby politician, and a lovelorn balloon have in common? They're all citizens of the candy-colored knitted world known as Mochimochi Land. Adventures in Mochimochi Land started out as a collection of tiny knitted characters, but as the patterns grew they needed an entire world of their own, complete with knitted cities, knitted forests, knitted oceans, and most important, knitted friends! The book follows the adventures of a tiny knitted explorer, as he travels this unbelievably cute world and uncovers its strange yarn-based origins. For intrepid knitters, the book also includes a section with 25 all-new patterns for the characters and props used in the stories. The patterns use small amounts of yarn and beginner-friendly knitting skills and knit up quickly for instant fun.

About the AuthorANNA HRACHOVEC launched Mochimochi Land (mochimochiland.com), a website and brand of knitted character designs, in early 2007. Her original knitted creations have been featured on television (Nickelodeon, The Martha Stewart Show), all around the web, and in print (The Chicago Tribune, Martha Stewart Living), as well as exhibited in galleries in New York, Seattle, Berlin, Tokyo, and Seoul. Anna has written four previous knitting books: Knitting Mochimochi, Teeny-Tiny Mochimochi, Super-Scary Mochimochi, and Huge Huggable Mochimochi. She lives in Chicago with her husband, John Teti.
