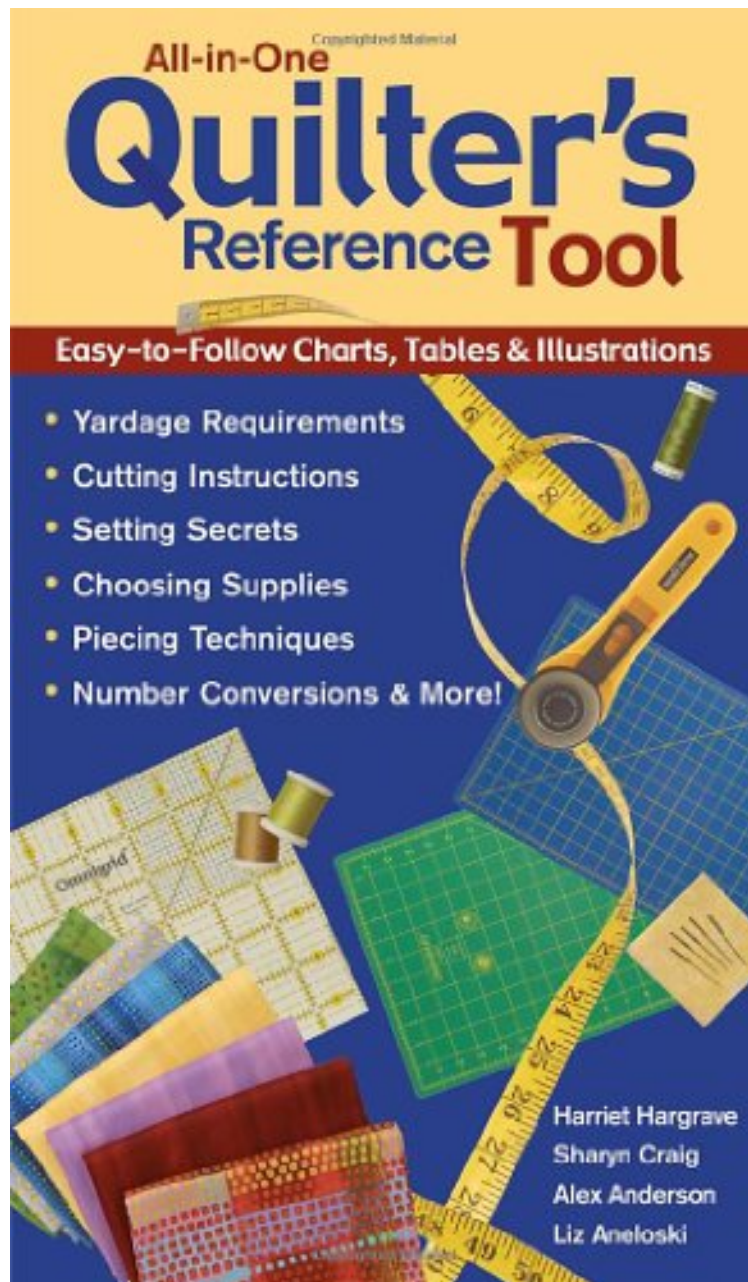

It's small enough to carry with you when shopping or to use easily if you're shopping online. I thought the yardages for adding sashing for both straight-set and diagonal-set quilts were especially useful, but there are all kinds of yardage requirements, binding methods, and various constructions that are explained with pictures too. There are tables of needle sizes for various fabrics, interesting ways of sewing many triangles at once, mitred borders, sleeves, and all sorts of information in addition to the tables. It's simply a resource that quilters won't want to be without.

These questions and many, many more are answered in this thin, convenient book that sits right beside my sewing machine. The book is wire bound so that it lays flat on the desk, and its small, thin design helps you keep it handy. It fits easily in my purse for trips to the fabric store.
