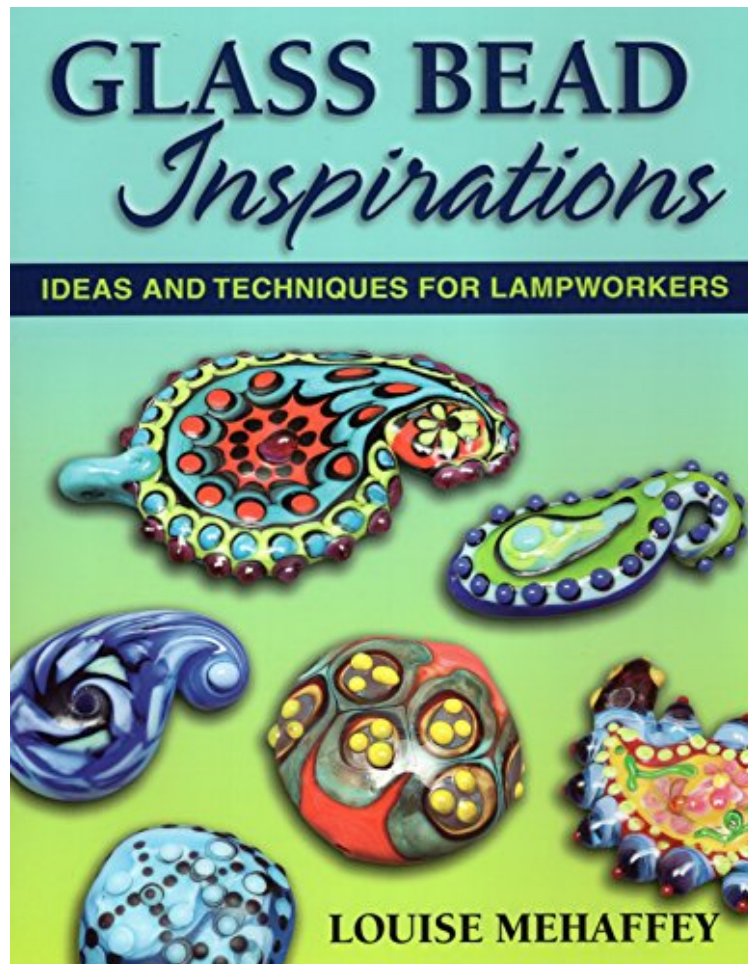

The first part consists of a series of challenges to a group of glass artists and pictures and descriptions of how they responded. The challenges include words - such as "The '70s, and picture inspirations - such as a painting. The artists' beads are well photographed. This part of the book does not provide step-by-step instructions on how to make the beads, but does discuss generally the techniques and glass used. Interestingly, the artists include comments of what they don't like about how their bead turned out. The second part of the book is detailed instructions of certain techniques and beads. The pictures are good, sometimes there are too many pictures for relatively straight-forward techniques. I think this is a nice addition to the
