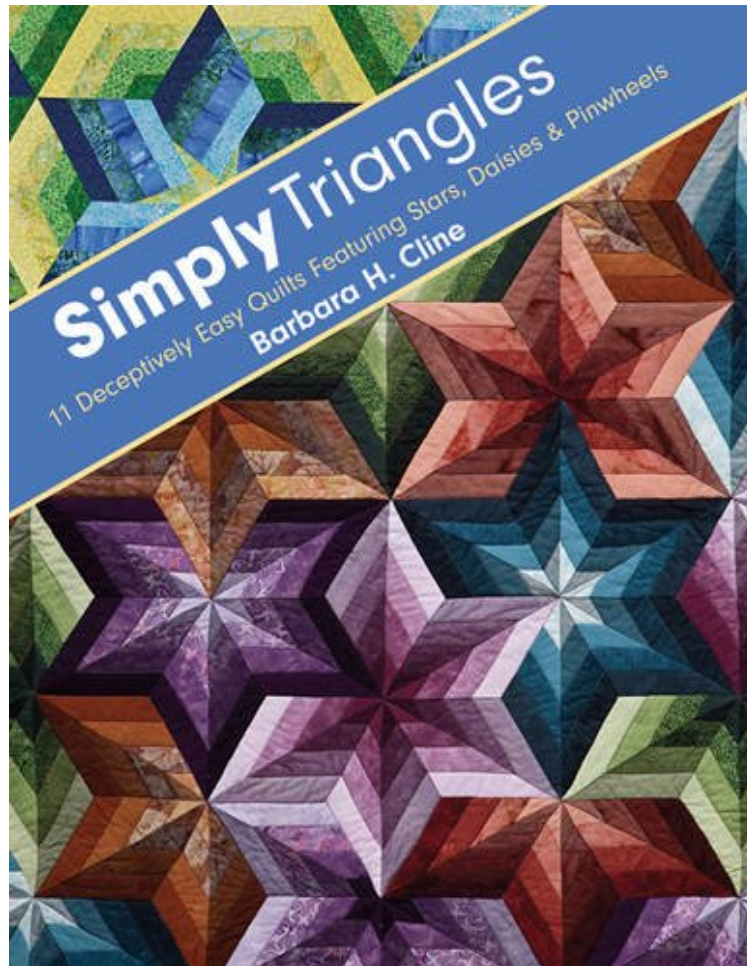

Simply Stunning Projects To Stretch Your Imagination (and Maybe Your Wallet)By SLSThe 11 projects in Barbara Cline's new book Simply Triangles are striking and lovely; Ms. Cline imparts a surprising amount of diversity to the humble 60-degree triangle. First, she dresses up the conventional 6-pointed star with 7 patterns that incorporate borders, stacked strippy units, and even applique (making for a very Dresden-like star). Next, triangles morph into flowers with 2 unique designs. Cline ends with two Pinwheel-

based projects: one is embellished with buttons and the other has a vivid tessellating appearance. Each project includes a short "Life Lessons" box illustrating the huge influence on the author of her Mennonite family. Photographs are in abundance, and highlight the exceptionally nice quilting details. Both traditional and contemporary quilters will find something very pleasing here. As for skill level, my opinion is that this book might be a challenge for some new beginners, as there are templates (included) and Y-seams; precision piecing skills will be a must. But I still recommend this book for all skill levels, as I remember when I first started out I went straight to the tough stuff so I could learn everything all at once. (In retrospect, perhaps that approach is not recommended!) Additionally, an endless supply of fabrics - or friends with fabrics - would be helpful because each quilt allows wonderful opportunities to play with value and contrast. This book is set apart from all the rest, and not just for its beautiful contents. Budget-conscious quilters might like to know there could be an extra ruler, an additional tool, and new products in their future: 1. Ruler - Creative Grids 60-degree Triangle Creative Grids 60 Degree Triangle (Finished Size Up to 8") Quilting Ruler. I was hoping I could use the Clear-View Triangle I already own, but no. The CG triangle is longer (and thus wider at the base) than the CV one, and most importantly the CG also has a differently configured tip. 2. Tool - Ms. Cline recommends using Jinny Beyer Perfect Piecer Quilt Template for help with Y-seams. 3. Materials - 108-inch wide black nylon netting (used as an overlay to create an amazing receding effect in several projects), batiste (for triangle foundations), 20-inch wide double-sided fusible web (Ms. Cline uses Shades SoftFuse which will add significant cost to your projects: each 8x9 inch segment is about 1.00 per piece). Ms. Cline is also the author of another absolutely stunning book *Star Struck Quilts: Dazzling Diamonds Triangular Blocks; 13 Skill-Building Projects*. Now that I own both books I am convinced she is in a class of her own, and the quilting industry is fortunate to have such an inventive talent. 29 of 30 people found the following review helpful. This project book by renowned quilter Barbara Cline features 11 stunning quilts in varying shapes and sizes. She shows you straightforward techniques to make complex-looking designs by combining simple shapes: triangles, trapezoids, diamonds. Plus, you'll discover how to use color and value to make these quilts glow. Includes skill-building techniques from strip piecing to Y-seams.

Are you ready for a triangle extravaganza? Just when you thought you had seen it all as far as the triangle is concerned, up pops another book with even more ideas for the use of the humble triangle. This book contains 11 deceptively easy quilts featuring stars, daisies and pinwheels, all with full instructions on how to create complex-looking designs for any size quilt by combining simple shapes like triangles and diamonds. There are also a number of skill-building techniques from strip piecing to the dreaded Y-seam, so here is a good opportunity to extend your repertoire. I enjoyed her first book, *Star Struck Quilts*, which focused on the eight-pointed Lone Star with numerous attractive variations. She continues her exploration of geometric designs using triangles in another well-written and well-illustrated book, *Simply Triangles* from CT Publishing. As the subtitle suggests, the author provides projects using triangles to make stars, daisies (with some clever machine applique), and tessellating pinwheels. *Simply Triangles* has many valuable quilt book features. Basic quilting supplies are sufficient for the projects using the provided templates, or two specialty tools that many quilters already own. Detailed instructions for increasingly complex projects include: hints for fabric selection, color value placement, marking, pinning, piecing and pressing. Especially helpful are step-by-step photographs and illustrations for the often dreaded Y-seam and mitered corners. Quilting design suggestions for each project include close-up shots of the author's lovely quilting in finished quilts. Barbara Cline's *Simply Triangles* is an excellent addition to any quilter's library as a skill-building resource and source of inspiration for future projects. I am eager to try her method of overlaying netting to add a three-dimensional effect. Although not a book for novice quilters, I would highly recommend this book to all quilters who want to expand their piecing skills, experiment with color values, and make fascinating quilts with a strong geometric statement.
