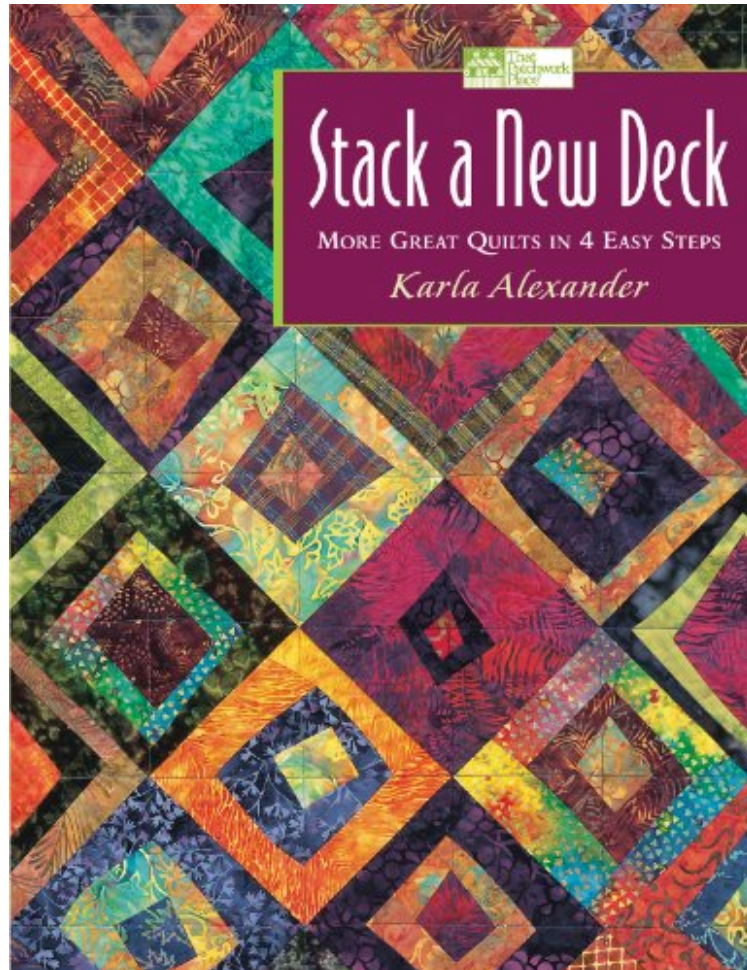

well. The author explains how to select fabrics, stack them for maximum effect in the quilt, sew curved pieces, chain-stitch segments, etc. She also offers helpful tips on keeping track of which segments go where in the blocks that you are building. I also appreciated the thorough explanation of finishing the quilt once the piecing is completed since I have yet to complete my first quilt. The step-by-step details and illustrations for layering, basting, and binding look like they will be easy to follow. Finally, the array of patterns offered are excellent. I'm really looking forward to making some of these quilts!
