It was created by Mary Hoyer to perfectly fit the beautiful hard plastic dolls that she designed and sold through a small knitting shop in Pennsylvania, and through knitting magazines. The patterns also fit many of the other 14 inch hard plastic dolls that were sold in that era, with minimal adjustments, like the Toni, RB and Madame Alexander dolls.
